My path to becoming a church musician has been unusual and unexpected. I first became Part Time Organist/Choir Director of a small Episcopal Church in 2005, more than 20 years after studying organ as a secondary instrument at the University of North Texas. At the time I was juggling church music with multiple family and occupational responsibilities. My "fit it in" approach to music continued for a number of years.

In 2016, the rhythm of my life shifted and I had more discretionary time. I made a commitment to several areas of self-improvement, one of them being to raise the bar with respect to the church music I was performing and directing. I looked into attending graduate school in organ performance, but the nearest program was 200 miles away from where I was living. About this time, a fellow organist suggested that I look into the AGO certification program. This was great advice!

I had a relatively easy time passing the Service Playing exam in early 2017, and soon after set my sites on the Colleague Exam. Some of the requirements for the Colleague Exam were not parts of my regular church routine and stretched my skill set considerably. The most challenging parts for me were organ accompaniment of vocal repertoire, hymn transposition, and structured modulation. Additionally, it was a requirement that the actual exam be performed on an organ other than my home church, and I had very little experience on organs other than the basic tracker-action instrument at my home church.

Several months of preparation paid off for me, and I was successful at passing the Colleague Exam in November of 2018. Feeling rather "full of myself," I decided to apply for a few full-time music positions. I was honestly very surprised to hear from my current employer, Fellowship Lutheran Church, within a few days, and I credit the Colleague Exam certification as what prompted that first interview.

The Choirmaster certification material is on my desk. It includes a lot of Music History that seems daunting to me right now, but I am going to push myself to prepare for this exam once COVID has passed.

The AGO certification program does a great job of considering the whole musician. I would recommend the program to anyone who is interested in continuing education and improvement.
